On June 29th **Katelyn Emerson** played her Graduate Organ Recital at the *Hochschule für Musik und darstellende Kunst* in Stuttgart where she has been studying with Prof. Dr. Ludger Lohmann on a scholarship. She finished her Masters' program there with the highest possible score. *Congratulations, Katelyn! We all wish you continuing success with your career!*

Bernard Wayne Sanders' "Partita on the Lourdes Hymn" has been accepted for publication by the Dr. J. Butz Verlag of Bonn, Germany. The original Triptych on this theme was commissioned by Our Lady of Lourdes parish in De Pere, Wisconsin, USA, for the dedication of their new organ. The Partita now encompasses six movements in all. It is scheduled for release in the course of this year.

Johan Hermans performed an Organ Meditation every Tuesday afternoon at the Hasselt Cathedral from April 21st until the end of June. On May 2nd, June 6th and July 4th he also played substitute programs there for guest artists who couldn't come. These were live-streamed via facebook.

European News

The **International Organ Academy of Strasbourg** will take place from the 9th to the 15th of August, 2020. Teachers will be: Vincent Dubois, François Espinasse, Martin Gester, Baptiste-Florian Marle-Ouvrard, Jérôme Mondésert, Damien

Simon, and Aline Zylberajch. Organs to be included are: Walcker and Garnier at St. Paul, Merklin at Temple Neuf, Thomas at Bouclier, Silbermann at St. Thomas and at St. Aurélie. Participants can concentrate on repertoire of the 17th and 18th Century, 19th and 20th Century or improvisation, German Baroque or French Baroque repertoire, or music for Clavichord from the 17th and 18th Century (beginners or advanced). The cost for active participation is 390 €, student active participation (under 28 years old) 290 €, or passive participation 190 €. A downpayment of 50 € should be submitted with the application. Pipe Dreams American Public Media presents a tour of Historic Organs of **Alsace** from May 22nd through June 6th, 2021. The itinerary includes the cities of Strasbourg, Mulhouse, Colmar, Ebersmunster and Marmoutier among many other smaller towns in the Alsace Region along the Rhine River border between France and Germany. Hosts are J. Michael Barone, well-known for his broadcasts of American Public Media's Pipedreams, Carolyn Shuster Fournier, a French American organist musicologist currently titulaire of the choir organ in St. Trinité in Paris, and Tim Schmutzler from Berlin, who has been accompanying Pipedreams journeys to Europe since 2016. The itinerary not only includes instruments by illustrious masters such as Silbermann, Merklin, Callinet, Mutin, Cavaillé-Coll and Walcker but also organs by lesser known organbuilders of regional renown, such as Rinckenbach, Stiehr, Ræthinger, Schwenkedel, DalsteinHaerpfer etc., and also newer instruments by Kern and Mühleisen.
